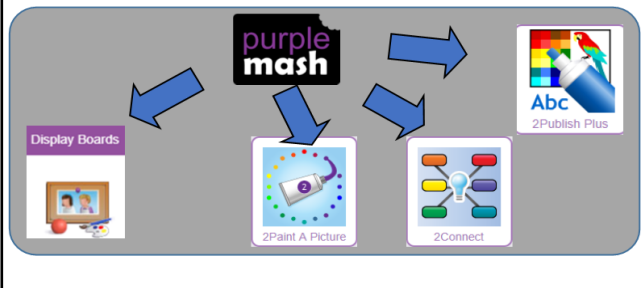

## Curriculum Capture for Year 5 Computing: Online Safety

Key Knowledge
<p><b>Who do I tell if I see anything online that makes me upset or scared?</b></p> <p>When you are at school you should tell the teacher or another adult. At home you should tell your parent or guardian or another adult that you trust.</p>
<p><b>Why are passwords so important?</b></p> <p>Passwords protect your information and stop other people accessing it. Passwords are like a toothbrush; they should not be shared with anyone else.</p>
<p><b>Why is it important to reference sources in my work?</b></p> <p>If you use a book or article written by someone else, then you must reference it, so people know where you got the information from. If you don't do this then it is known as plagiarism.</p>
<p><b>What are the key resources to learn about online safety?</b></p>



Vocabulary	
<b>Online safety</b>	Refers to staying safe when having a presence online.
<b>Smart rules</b>	A set of rules based around the word SMART designed to help you stay safe when online.
<b>Password</b>	A string of characters that allows access to a computer system or service.
<b>Reputable</b>	Having a good reputation.
<b>Encryption</b>	The process of converting information or data into a code, especially to prevent unauthorized access.
<b>Identity theft</b>	The practice of using another person's name and personal information in order to obtain credit, loans, etc.
<b>Shared image</b>	A picture that is shared online for other people to see.
<b>Plagiarism</b>	The practice of taking someone else's work or ideas and passing them off as one's own.
<b>Citations</b>	A quotation from or reference to a book, paper, or author, especially in an academic work.
<b>Reference</b>	A mention of a source of information in a book or article including online.
<b>Bibliography</b>	A list of all the books and articles used in a piece of work.

**IS FOR SAFE**  
Never give out personal information to strangers on the internet. Personal information includes things like your home address and your birthday.

**IS FOR NEVER MEET**  
Never ever meet up with a stranger you have met online unless a parent or guardian has said it is ok and is present. Never, never, never, never, never.

**IS FOR ACCEPTING**  
Don't believe everything you read online, check your facts! Did you read it on a reliable website like the BBC? Are other websites saying the same thing? Does it tell you where they got the information from?

**IS FOR RELIABLE**  
Don't believe everything you read online, check your facts! Did you read it on a reliable website like the BBC? Are other websites saying the same thing? Does it tell you where they got the information from?

**IS FOR TELL**  
If you have an online safety problem, make sure you tell someone. Tell a parent, guardian, or teacher as soon you can.
