Vocabulary

The proms	The Proms, or the BBC Proms, more formally known as the Henry Wood Promenade Concerts, is an eight-week summer season of daily orchestral classical music concerts and other events held annually, predominantly in the Royal Albert Hall in central London
Music hall	Music hall is a type of British theatrical entertainment that was popular from the early Victorian era, beginning around 1850. It faded away after 1918 as the halls rebranded their entertainment as variety.
variations	In music, variation is a formal technique where material is repeated in an altered form. The changes may involve melody, rhythm, harmony, timbre, orchestration or any combination of these.
rapping	Rapping is a musical form of vocal delivery that incorporates "rhyme, rhythmic speech, and street vernacular", which is performed or chanted in a variety of ways, ...
