Key Knowledge	
What is a sculpture?	Natural sculptures
3D art made by casting, carving, modelling or constructing materials. Stone or wood may be carved. Metal or plaster may be casted.	Using natural sculptures made by Andy Goldsworthy as a starting point for my own 3D sculpture, I may use: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pebbles • Bark • Leaves • Sticks • Grass • Pine cones • Mud • Ice
What can a sculpture be made from?	Recycled material sculptures
Sculptures can be made from a variety of materials, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • stone • wood • metal • plaster • clay • leaves, flowers, sticks • cardboard, plastic bottles etc. <p>They can be connected in a range of ways: twisting, indenting, using water, paper, wire and tape.</p>	Using sculptures by Barbara Hepworth as a starting point for my own recycled 3D sculpture, I may use: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cardboard • Plastic wrap • Plastic containers including bottles • Netting • Foil

He now lives in Scotland. • A British sculptor and photographer. • He is an environmentalist which is someone who wants to protect the environment around them. • He produces sculptures and land art situated in natural and urban settings. • His work is meant to be temporary. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Born in Yorkshire in 1903. • She died in 1975. • A British sculptor • Her artwork was inspired by the landscape and nature around her. • She worked with wood, stone and bronze.
