# 2023 tests at Key Stage 2

- Children will be tested in:
  - English Reading
  - English grammar, punctuation and spelling
  - Mathematics

# 2023 tests at Key Stage 2

- English Reading
  - 1 singular paper comprising of three different texts.
  - Range of questions with a heavy focus on retrieval and inference skills.
  - 1, 2 and 3 mark questions.

# 2023 tests at Key Stage 2

- English grammar, punctuation and spelling (2 papers)
  - Grammar, Punctuation & Vocabulary (50 marks) which is 45 minutes long.
  - Spelling Paper (20 marks) which lasts somewhere between 15-20 minutes.

# 2023 tests at Key Stage 2

- Mathematics (3 papers)
  - Paper 1 – Arithmetic which is 30 minutes (40 marks)

Focus on pure number work involving:

- 4 main operations (including long division & multiplication)
- Fraction calculations

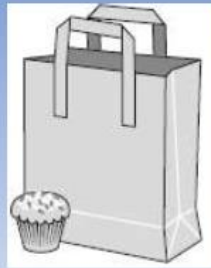
# 2023 tests at Key Stage 2

- Mathematics (3 papers)
  - Papers 2 & 3 – Reasoning which are 40 minutes (35 marks each)

Questions are often set in a real-life context but there are sometimes questions around number.

# 2023 tests at Key Stage 2

Maria bakes cakes and sells them in bags.



She uses this formula to work out how much to charge for one bag of cakes.

$$\text{Cost} = \text{number of cakes} \times 20\text{p} + 15\text{p for the bag}$$

How much will a bag of 12 cakes cost?



# Scaled Scores

- Test results for KS2 will be in 'scaled scores'.
- The expected standard will always be set at a 100.
- The raw scores in the tests will be converted to a scaled score according to the national spread of results.
- Pupils who score 100 or more will have met the expected standard.
- Pupils who score below 100 will not have met the expected standard.



# 2023 Teacher Assessment

- For English Writing – 3 standards
  - Working towards the expected standard.
  - Working at the expected standard.
  - Working at greater depth within the expected standard.

There is no requirement for teacher assessment for Maths & Reading as there has been in previous years.

# Access Arrangements?

- Additional Time
  - Reader / Prompter
  - Rest breaks
  - Scribes
  - Smaller / quieter environment
- Illness / injury during test week.

# What can you do at home?

Talk 😊 Discuss things that you see and do. Challenge their vocabulary.

- Encourage reading.
- Use everyday opportunities to discuss maths ideas – shopping.
- Practise number bonds.
- Practise multiplication tables.
- During test week, relax and focus on other things.
