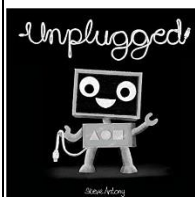


## Online Safety Books

### Unplugged (Picture Book)

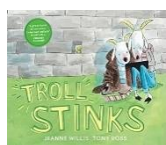
**Key area of learning- Screen Time**

### Troll Stinks (Picture Book)

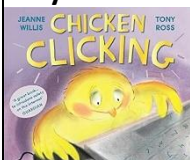
**Key area of learning- How to behave online and people online are not always who they say they are**

### Chicken Clicking (Picture Book)

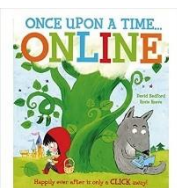
**Key area of learning- Asking an adult before going online and people online are not always who they say they are**

### Once Upon a Time Online (Picture Book)

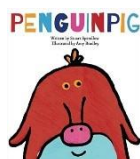
**Key area of learning- asking an adult before going online/doing online shopping**

### Penguinpig

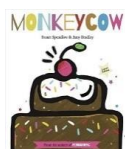
**Key area of learning- People online are not always who they say they are**

### Monkeycow

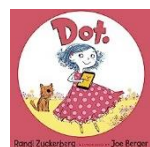
**Key area of learning- People online are not always who they say they are and keeping passwords secure and safe**

### Dot

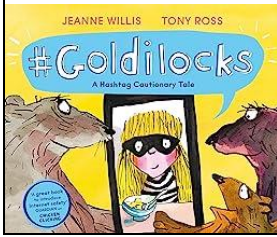
**Key area of learning- Screen Time**
