ACCOMODATION

POCKET MONEY AND MOBILE PHONES/ ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Children can bring up to £25 in a named purse, which is £5 a day.

This will be collected by your child's key person and given out at the start of each day

Mobile phones and electronic devices are definitely not allowed – please respect this rule and do not encourage your child to sneak one along. We want the children to enjoy the experience without the use of these devices.

MEDICAL ISSUES

- Medication will be kept by each child's key person
- It will go wherever they go throughout the trip.
- Mrs Blackaby is our officer in charge of medications and ensures all medications are given at the correct times

MORNING OF DEPARTURE

- The children should be brought straight to the side entrance of the gym at 6.15am.
- They will register at one station
- They will hand in any medication at another station
- They will hand in their pocket money purses at a third station. The purses/ wallets should be named and easily identifiable – they will be kept by adults throughout the trip and given out/ collected in when needed.
- The children will then be told who their supervising adult will be
- They will be told about their room mates when we get to the hotel and not before.

NEXT STEPS

- Assemble the children's kit, PLEASE do this with them so they know what they have.
- IMPORTANT Your child must be able to carry their own case. We are not able to help your child to carry their case and their rooms may be upstairs.
- Please ensure your children have a lot of sleep over the weekend before the trip – it is a very hectic trip and they will need a lot of energy!

FINALLY

The Isle of Wight Residential trip is usually a lot of fun but we have to remember that we are all part of a big group.

Working together and helping each other. Being good to each other as we are all away from home. Staff will expect good behaviour at all times.

The staff team will endeavour to post pictures on the web site regularly but please understand that this is usually a very busy trip and we may not be able to keep you up to date as often as you may like!

We will be in contact with the school on our journey home and they will keep you informed about our arrival time. It may be around 5pm but we cannot guarantee this because of Friday afternoon traffic.
