Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you enjoyed watching our sharing assemblies this week - the children had a great time, and we were proud of their effort and performances! In English, the children wrote their own historical narratives based on the story, 'Viking Boy' by Tony Bradman. They chose their own characters and their own exciting endings. Home learning: Our Y4 focus is times tables (ready for our multiplication check in June) and reading. To best support your children, please encourage them to practise times tables at home whenever possible, as well as reading both with you and independently.

Multiplication check

In June 2024, all Year 4 children will take part in a multiplication check to test their times table fluency. Times tables are fundamental to maths success and thus is important that children leave Year 4 feeling confident with these.
