



Dear Parents and Carers,

The children wrote their own versions of Stone Age Boy this week, they created their own problem for the main character in the book and thought hard about describing each scene so the reader could imagine the Stone Age time the book was set in. In maths, the children have been learning about time and months of the year. In science, the children have continued to monitor their plant investigation, they have begun to record their results on a graph. This experiment will continue until the end of the term. In history, the children looked at the different food that was eaten and eventually farmed during the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age and noted how the people moved from being 'hunter/gatherers to farmers. In PSHE the children were discussing why it is important to keep clean and in RE the children learnt about the 5 Pillars of Islam.
