
Waterbeach Community Primary School Year 6 Team Letter

Exciting things the children will be learning in the Summer term...

Our topic this term will be mainly focused around our trip to the Isle of Wight.

We will investigate the history of the island including some field work on our visits to Carisbrooke Castle and Osborn House. We will also look at the geographical similarities and differences between the Isle of Wight and areas that we have studied this year and of course our local environment.

In Science we will be investigating the circulatory system before moving onto the ageing system linking nicely to our Maths. In RE, we will be trying to explain what matters most through looking at the views of Christians and Humanists. In PSHE, we will be focusing on our personal safety before moving onto the very real topic for the children in terms of managing change. In ICT we will looking at 3d modelling and how to create a webpage. In PE, the children will be completing a unit on Athletics and Swimming (fingers crossed) and a new unit based around disability sports. PE

Pandas/Tree Kangaroos – Monday & Thursday

Children should have a PE kit consisting of: a house colour T-shirt without buttons, dark plain shorts, jogging bottoms, a jumper and a change of shoes for outdoors. No jewellery should be worn during Physical Education lessons including swimming. It is also not safe to cover earrings / studs / sleepers with tape. If children wear earrings to school, they need to be able to remove them themselves for PE lessons. If your child is unable to do so, earrings should be removed before coming to school. We advise that if you are going to allow your child to have their ears pierced, that this is done at the start of the summer holidays so that their PE entitlement is not compromised.

In our experience, many children tend to lose some of their good reading habits during time away from school and this can set back their progress. As we need to be able to read to access nearly all other subjects, we really want all our children to retain the skills they have worked so hard to achieve this year. If you would like to see which books have Accelerated Reader quizzes, you can check using this website. They can then quiz these on their return to school.

You will have also seen a letter detailing the strategies we use for the four main mathematical operations. If you wanted to complete any examples over Easter period or beyond, it is always good to keep these skills bubbling over in the background while we learn new concepts in class.

!Jewellery!

Please can all additional jewellery be left at home. There have been several children wearing necklaces be that in plain sight or underneath clothes – please can these be kept at home thus reducing the risk of necklaces being caught in class/corridors or lost in school especially if they hold sentimental value.

We are continuing to have a difficult time with hooped earrings being worn by some children – can we insist that children wear just studded earrings reducing the risk of earrings being caught accidentally in class/corridors.
