<p>What makes a good photograph?</p>	<p>What is the difference between landscape and portrait photographs?</p>
<p>A photograph is composed by a photographer.</p> <p>You need to think about:</p> <p>Positioning: Make the main subject of the photograph clear.</p> <p>Framing: Have you included everything you wanted to?</p> <p>Subject: Are you close enough to see the detail?</p>	<p>A photograph can be taken in either portrait or landscape format.</p> <p>Upright = portrait Sideways = landscape</p> <p>A photographer may favour portrait or landscape for different reasons: A photograph of a person looks best in portrait. A photograph of a place looks best in landscape.</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: center; gap: 20px;">   </div>
<p>How can photographs be changed?</p>	<p>How can I tell if a photo is real?</p>
<p>Light and focus are important aspects of good photography composition.</p> <p>Good lighting makes a good quality photograph.</p> <p>Using the camera flash and adding an artificial light source effects photos.</p> <p>The camera autofocus tool can be used to make an object in an image stand out.</p> <p>We use image editing software to change the colour effect of an image.</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: center; gap: 20px;">   </div>	<p>Some images can be changed for a purpose.</p> <p>Not all images we see are real.</p> <p>We look for clues to find out if a photo has been changed.</p> <p>It can be tricky - even adults get this wrong sometimes!</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div>

Portrait	A photograph taken with the camera upright.
Landscape	A photograph taken with the camera sideways.
