Dear Parents and Carers,

In history this week the children have learned about the different Roman invasions on Britain, from Julius Caesar through to Claudius. In science the children investigated how natural changes to the environment have affected living things. They looked at how different animals adapt to their environment, how some animals use camouflage, some are nocturnal, some migrate and some hibernate. In RE, the children are studying the unit, 'What is the Trinity?', Christians believe that God is Trinity: God as three in one - Father, Son and Holy Spirit and they looked at a variety of paintings in which this concept had been portrayed. In PSHE, the children have been learning about different types of drugs and who safely administers them. During indoor PE, the children have been having a go at some different disability sports, they have been trying 'sit down volleyball' during indoor PE and during outdoor PE lessons the children are covering different athletic sports, this week they had a go at relays.

Forest school: will be on Tuesday 30th April. Please remember to bring a change of shoes for your child so they can explore the muddy forest area.

Home Learning: Reading is the main focus of the school, and each child has their own login for Collins E-Books, these books have been set to each child's individual level from school assessments and practise reading the sounds in these books would be beneficial to your child's continued progress in reading. There is a new list of summer home learning activities on Teams. If your child would like to, they can choose one activity to have a go at a week. Their finished tasks can be upload on Teams and shared with the class. There are activities set on Mathletics which relates to the fraction unit in maths which they will be looking at during the first few weeks of the summer term. They also have access to Spelling Shed and Times Table Rockstars.

In Maths, we will be continuing this term's topic of fractions. We will be:

- Exploring fractions on scales and number lines.
- Counting fractions on a number line.
- Finding equivalent fractions on a number line and as a bar model.

In English the children are continuing to look at the book, 'The Village that Vanished' by Ann Grafalconi to inspire their writing.

In spelling, we will be learning to spell words where the digraph sc makes an s sound.
