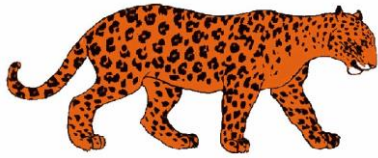

The purpose of this letter is to give you important information about the term ahead. You will find details about home learning, reading books and other documents that you will be receiving to help you to support your child in their learning. Message from the team

Wow, what a busy term! The highlight of this half term has been seeing the awe and wonder on the faces of the children (and staff!) whilst watching the eggs hatch and when holding or stroking a duckling for the first time. Our trip to Church Farm was also a brilliant day out! The children were incredibly well behaved and caring towards the animals on the farm.

A huge thank you to the PTA for organising a hugely successful event last weekend to improve our EYFS Garden. With the help of a group of wonderful and hardworking volunteers who gave up time on a Saturday to join us, we were able to remove old AstroTurf, dig over and flatten the area, jet wash where needed, move a wooden teepee and gardening station into the area, sand and varnish our woodwork bench and clear equipment no longer needed. The children were very excited to see the garden on Monday morning and being able to use much more of the space during their play. A group today have spread grass seed in the area and are looking forward to (hopefully!) watching it to grow over the next few months.

Exciting things the children will be learning in the Summer Term

We have two exciting topics to learn about in the Summer term: **'How does your garden grow?'** and **'Nature Explorers'**.

How does your garden grow?

When we return after the Easter Holidays, we will read and watch a version of the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk' to begin our topic. Over the first half term, we will read the traditional tale, alongside some alternative versions of the story and share our opinions of these. We will learn the story of Jack and the Beanstalk using actions to help us and draw our own story maps. We will celebrate Earth Day on Friday 25th April and we will have the opportunity to plant and grow our own beans and sunflowers (as well as a few more things). We will learn about how different plants and flowers grow and take part in an experiment to investigate the things that plants need to grow. We will also learn some Jack and the Beanstalk songs which we will perform on stage. Please see dates below.

Nature Explorers

Our second topic will begin after half term. We will start this topic by going on a bug hunt in our Orchard and will have an exciting delivery of caterpillars. We will learn about the life cycle of the butterfly and have first-hand experience of the transformation of caterpillar to butterfly while we care for the caterpillars in the classroom. We will also create a 'minibeast lab' to observe different insects in the classroom. We will read some of the minibeast themed stories from the Eric Carle series and focus on 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' in more detail. We will, again, learn the story using actions to help us, we will create our own story maps and innovate the story. We will celebrate the end of the topic and end of the school year by having a 'Beautiful Bug Ball.'

SNACK & LUNCH

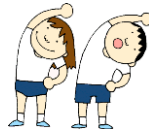

TOYS FROM HOME

Please note that children are NOT allowed to bring any toys from home into school in case they get broken or lost.

PE

For the first half term, our P.E. sessions will be **Ball Skills** and will continue to take place on **Tuesdays**. Children will need shorts, t-shirts and plimsols only for these lessons. Please ensure all long hair is clipped/tied back for PE lessons and earrings are removed before coming to school.



We ask that all PE kits are kept in a drawstring bag and are left in school. We send home PE kits at the end of each term for washing during holiday time.

Forest School

Foundation Stage will continue to go to the woodland once a week and this will continue to be on **Thursdays**.



On Thursdays, children should come to school dressed in old clothes that are suitable for getting mucky and practical for activities such as climbing trees and den building in all weathers. Please ensure their legs and arms are covered. Dresses are not appropriate for Forest School. Children should also bring a change of shoes, preferably wellies, with them to wear whilst they are in the forest area. Please make sure they wear their normal school shoes to school. Please ensure your child has a **rain coat** with them at school every day as we use the outdoor space every day and our weather is often unpredictable.

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HOME LEARNING

Reading: Each week the children will bring home a Little Wandle Reading book linked to the child's phonic knowledge. This is a book that they should 'show off' and celebrate their reading with you after they have three reading practice sessions in school. **Please return this book to school every Monday.**

We will also send home a copy of the **tricky words** as we learn them. Please keep these at home and practice reading these with your child. Your child should be able to read these words on sight.

Children will also bring a 'choice' book home which we ask you to read **to** your child and share the pleasure of reading a book together. It is important to aim to read daily to your child. **Please keep this book in your child's book bag so that we can change these weekly.**

COMMUNICATION

We aim to have open communication channels to keep you informed about everything that is going on in school and to give easy access to speak to us if needed. Ways we can communicate:

School/team letters – all letters are sent via email.

Weekly learning sharing – every Friday an email is sent out to give you an overview of what the children will be learning about the following week, this may also have important notices on.

Website – we hope the website is a good reference source, if there are things that you would like to see included, please let us know.

Email – you can send emails to your child's class teacher or team leader. The protocol is that teachers will respond within 3 working days. If you need a more urgent response, then you can leave a message with the school office or send a note to your child's class teacher.
